Save energy, save money

Even if the weather is still cold enough to give you chills, your utility bill doesn't have to. Just follow some of these tips to save money.

For your electric bill:

- » Set your thermostat at 68 degrees. Each degree higher uses 3 percent more energy.
- » Lower your thermostat when you leave home. You'll use much less energy to heat the house while you are away.
- » Let the sun shine in. Open curtains and shades on eastern and southern windows during the day to let in more heat, then close them in the evening.
- » Add insulation to water heaters and hot water pipes to save energy and money. This is inexpensive and easy.

» Caulk and weatherstrip windows and doors.

For your water bill:

- » Don't water outside in fall and winter months; turn off automatic irrigation.
- » Wash only full loads in your dishwasher and washing machine.
- » Take shorter showers place a timer in the bathroom.
- » Look for the WaterSense® label when buying new water-using appliances and fixtures.

Drainage charge data updated

The City of Austin's Watershed Protection Department updated the impervious cover data used to calculate the drainage charge. This may result in your drainage charge being lower or higher than it was last month. For 85 percent of accounts, there is either no change or the change is less than a dollar.

The drainage charge is calculated individually for each property based on the amount and percent of impervious cover. Impervious cover includes rooftops, patios, driveways, parking lots and other surfaces that do not absorb rainfall. Information about impervious cover is obtained through a combination of aerial photography and building permit data.

For most properties, the impervious cover used to calculate your drainage charge can be viewed on the "Find My Drainage Charge" tool at **austintexas.gov/drainagecharge**. If you are concerned about how your impervious cover has been represented, please call Customer Care at **512-494-9400** and ask for a review of your drainage charge.

The drainage charge helps protect our community from flooding, erosion and water pollution.





What to do if a car hits a utility pole


If you crash into a utility pole while driving or see another vehicle crash into one, there are some things you need to know to stay safe. The entire crash site could be energized from a downed wire. If you hit a utility pole, especially if you see downed wires, don't get out of your car. Call **9-1-1**. Only leave the car if it's on fire, and don't step onto the pavement while in contact with the car. Jump out instead. Anyone around the crash site should not approach the car.
