Earn a \$75 rebate by reducing waste at home

Don't throw away your food scraps or leftovers! Austin Resource Recovery can help you reduce your food waste with their Home Rebate Program. The program offers a \$75 rebate toward the purchase of a home composting system or chicken coop to eligible residents.

With a home composting system, you can keep an average of 280 pounds out of your trash cart each year and create nutrient-rich soil for your lawn or garden. Chickens — which can eat many food scraps — provide free eggs, eat bugs in your yard and help fertilize your grass.

Keeping compostable items out of area landfills extends the life of the landfills, improves Austin's air quality and reduces harmful greenhouse gases.

Selling a home? Make sure it's ECAD compliant

Selling a home this spring? Choose which steps to take to comply with the Energy Conservation Audit and Disclosure (ECAD) ordinance that requires home sellers to disclose home energy details to buyers during a real estate transaction. ECAD applies to homes 10 years old or older that fall within the Austin city limits and the Austin Energy service area.

Here's how you can comply with ECAD:

Option 1 — Schedule a home energy audit with a qualified ECAD Energy Professional, especially before putting your house on the market. Visit **austinenergy.com/go/ecad**.

Option 2 — Participate in a qualifying Austin Energy program.

City of Austin Utilities Online Customer Care has changed! At **coautilities.com**, you'll find an updated interface with improved functionality on any device and enhanced self-service options. Upon logging in, you can:

- » Sign up for billing and payment options like Paperless Billing, Autopay and Budget Billing.
- » Make payments and see your account balance update in real time.

- » Start, stop or transfer your utility services online with ease.

- » Manage multiple accounts from a single login.

Proper cleaning only happens when waste is disposed of the right way. If you find yourself looking for a waste hauler, please make sure that they are a licensed hauler, and if you are looking to become a waste hauler yourself, you can complete a license application at **austintexas.gov/hauler**.

All private haulers that collect, remove or transport waste, recycling and/or compost within the city must obtain a license. To receive a license, you need to have a list of vehicles you will be using, proof of insurance and a certificate of general and commercial auto liability insurance. The fee for a license is \$500, and it must be renewed annually.

Austin Code enforces this ordinance so that communities are kept clean and to prevent potentially hazardous illegal dumping sites.
