New on-demand service for easy battery and hazardous waste disposal

Disposing of batteries and other household hazardous waste (HHW) just got easier thanks to the new on-demand HHW collection service. City of Austin residential customers, which include single-family homes up to fourplexes, can schedule up to three collections a year. Scheduling an appointment is required, but easy. Use the Austin Recycles app, go to austintexas.gov/ondemand or call 3-1-1 to make an appointment.

Never throw batteries in the trash or recycling. Batteries can cause fires in carts, dumpsters, trucks, recycling facilities and the landfill. They can also create other environmental issues when not recycled properly. All Austin and Travis County residents can dispose of batteries at the Recycle and Reuse Drop-off Center. Appointments are required.

Why dig for coins when the Park ATX mobile app makes parking in Austin easy and convenient?

Go to **parkatxapp.com** or search for "Park ATX" in your app store, download it to your smart device and create an account. Once you're parked, look for Park ATX app signs, locate your parking zone and create a parking session.

And you can save money using the app! You get up to two free 15-minute parking sessions every 24 hours by using the validation codes FREE15ATX1 and FREE15ATX2. (The two codes cannot be used for the same session, and additional time past 15 minutes will be charged.)

Impervious cover updates

The Watershed Protection Department is updating impervious cover data, and some customers will see a change to the drainage charge on their bill. Impervious cover includes rooftops, driveways. parking lots and other surfaces that do not absorb rainwater. For most accounts. the update will result in no change or a change of less than \$1 per month. Accounts with the largest changes will receive additional notification via phone. The drainage charge funds solutions to flooding, erosion and water pollution. To learn more, visit
