Conserve water in the winter and save all year long

Did you know you can lower your wastewater costs for the next year by conserving water now?

Your water meter measures your monthly water use, but there is no meter on your wastewater line. To calculate your wastewater fee, Austin Water monitors your water usage during three consecutive winter billing periods and bases the fee on the daily average use during these months. The monitoring periods occur between mid-November and mid-March. Since water usage during these months is generally only inside household use, it's a good measure of the volume flowing through

your wastewater system. You can lower your wastewater costs for the next year by conserving water use during these billing periods.

Here's how to conserve water during these periods:

- » Fix leaky toilets and faucets
- » Don't water outside in fall and winter months; turn off automatic irrigation systems
- » Wash only full loads in your dishwasher and washing machine
- » Take shorter showers place a timer in the bathroom.
- » Look for the WaterSense® label when buying new water-using appliances and fixtures

Be careful with holiday lights and extension cords

Incandescent holiday lights release 90 percent of their energy as heat, which can cause fires. LED lights don't release heat – but hooking up LEDs doesn't mean you're off the hook. Make sure your lights have been inspected by an independent lab, and remember to check your outlets and plugs for damage or fraved wires.

One final rule: Don't connect extension cords to other extension cords. Use an approved power strip instead.

Weatherize for winter to lower bills **RECYCLE**



Austin Energy helps incomeeligible homeowners and renters save energy and improve indoor comfort through no-cost home weatherization

assistance. These improvements can help lower utility bills for qualifying customers. They may include:

- » Attic insulation
- » Weatherstripping on doors
- » Minor duct repair or replacement

- » Carbon monoxide and smoke detectors
- » Solar screens
- » High-efficiency lighting
- » Water-saving improvements

The weatherization process includes a home energy assessment as well as testing for natural gas leaks and carbon monoxide to reduce health and safety hazards. Recommendations are based on assessment results and available funding.

Give your Christmas tree another life

City of Austin curbside customers may recycle their Christmas tree curbside beginning Dec. 26, on regularly scheduled collection days. Trees 6 feet or taller must be cut in half and set at the curb by 6:30 a.m. Or, drop off your tree at the Zilker Park Polo Fields between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Dec. 29 and 30, and Jan. 5 and 6.

When recycling, remember:

- » No trees sprayed with artificial snow
- » Remove all ornaments, decorations, lights and tree stand
- » Do not place tree in a tree bag
- » Only natural Christmas trees may be recycled.
