Enjoy Summer Savings: Lower your utility bills as summer heat rises

Summer's here and so are the high temperatures. The good news is that you can monitor and manage your electric and water bills. Knowing how much electricity and water you are using is a great first step to conservation.

You can access the free Austin Energy web app to monitor your daily energy use and forecast your energy costs. The web app also lets you receive alerts when your use is approaching a higherpriced tier so you can adjust your electricity use.

You can also download the free Dropcountr home water use report from Austin Water to create your customized water use profile with information about past water use. You can then receive suggestions on saving water as well as details about water conservation programs.

To access the Austin Energy web app, visit austinenergyapp.com and enter your City of Austin Utilities username and password. To sign up for Dropcountr, create an account at the Dropcountr website, dropcountr.com/dashboard/signin or download the app from the Apple or Android app stores.

Remember these tips to save on utility bills:

- » Change your AC filter every month.
- » Install LED bulbs and turn off lights when you leave the room.
- » Set your thermostat to 78 degrees or higher.
- » Fix leaky faucets and take shorter showers.
- » Unplug chargers and other electronics when not in use.
- » Water your lawn on your assigned day and time.
- » Visit a local library to stay cool.
- » Wash clothes in cold water.
- » Check out Home Performance with ENERGY STAR® if your house was built before 2010. Rebates and low-interest loans help with these upgrades.

Stay safe. Sign up for Warn Central Texas.

Are you prepared for all kinds of emergencies? Sign up for alerts at warncentraltexas.org and stay informed before, during and after any emergency. This notification system allows emergency personnel to contact residents about a disaster or public safety event in their area via text, email or phone. The warncentraltexas.org alert system is provided by the Capital Area Council of Governments for Bastrop, Blanco, Burnet, Caldwell, Fayette, Hays, Lee, Llano, Travis and Williamson counties.

Austin Code wants to know, are you Summer Ready?

Summer should be about running barefoot in your yard, barbeques and pool parties, NOT bug bites!

The Texas summer heat and standing water are ideal conditions for mosquitoes and other bugs to thrive. Before the summer heats up, do a quick look around your house:

- » Your lawn should be 12 inches or shorter.
- » Flip over buckets or plastic containers that are filled with dirty water.

» You can donate larger, unwanted items, and you can take tires and other recyclables to a local recycling center. DO NOT throw them in your alley or create a dumping location.

We're on the roads again!

Austin Public Works is improving more than 500 streets this summer. Sealcoat is the City's preventative street maintenance. It has been used for several decades to keep streets in good condition.

Here's what you need to know:

- » Loose rock is common and takes time to fully settle.
- » Avoid sharp turning and hard braking to prevent spreading loose rock.
- » Park vehicles away from streets for two days while work is being done.
- » Be on the lookout for signs and door hangers for more specific timing.
